Children in reception have been enjoying painting in the style of Vincent Van-gogh and writing independently

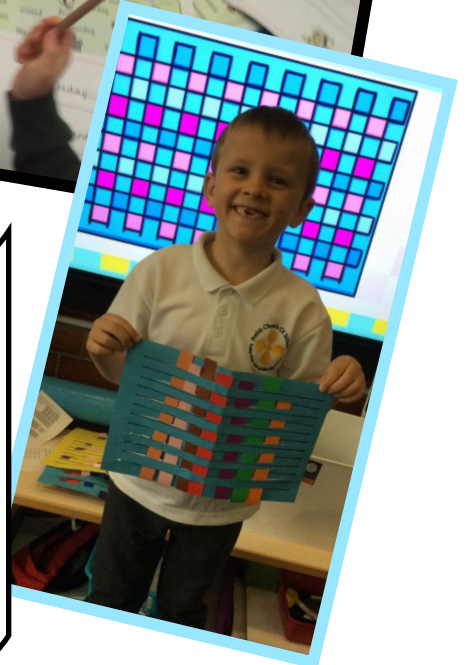
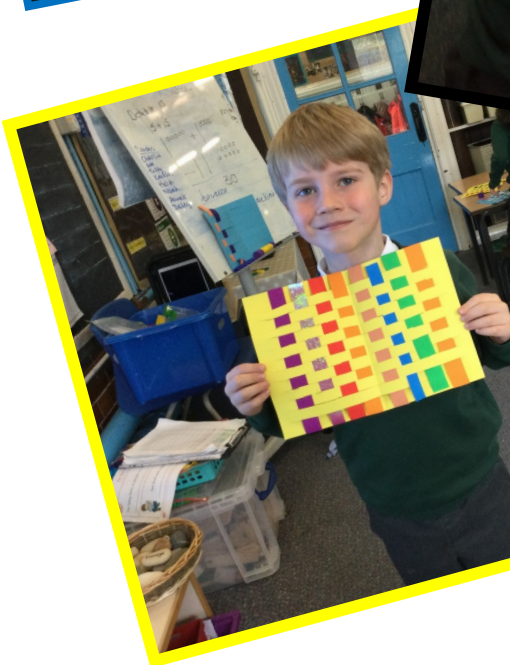


Herdwick Class have started their Fairtrade project and have studied El Salvador
