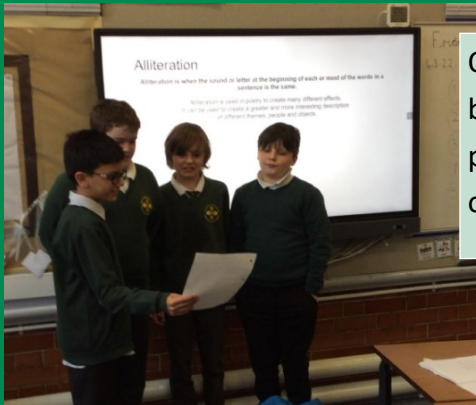
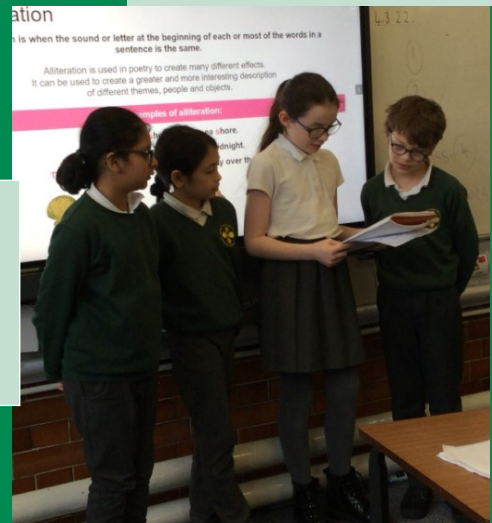
Around school this week
