What Are the Benefits of Reading for Children?

Reading allows us to be transported from our own world to another. Between the pages of a book, we can become immersed in the lives of fictional characters and learn about a culture entirely different from our own. We can also learn new words and phrases, experience a range of emotions, and acquire skills and knowledge.

Numerous pieces of research have discovered the profound benefits of reading for a child's development. One study details the effects of reading on later literacy skills, facilitating social interaction between adults and children, and encouraging children to engage with the world around them. It also states how reading can be a 'stable source of information' throughout a child's life. This stability allows them to access text in a constant fashion and can be especially beneficial for children growing up in challenging circumstances.

The more that a child is read to, and the more that they read themselves, the better they will become at it. Practice *really does* make perfect and, the more a child reads, the better their overall academic achievement and social skills, like empathy, will be.

Most importantly, it's fun!
